Early voting for the Tuesday, November 8, 2016 General Election begins on Thursday, October 27th and ends on Thursday November 3rd. Voting is open from 8am until 8pm. To see a list of 2016 early voting centers, click here.

- · Other government document with your name and address





Beginning in November, 2016, Maryland voters will use a new voter-verifiable paper record voting system. This new system will replace the touchscreen voting system used in previous years.

**Voter-verifiable Paper Voting System:** Voters will mark a paper ballot and then feed the ballot into a ballot scanner. The scanner will read the voter's selection and the ballot will drop into a locked ballot box.

The scanner uses technology that can identify the voters selections. When you mark your ballot by hand, the scanner will look for marks inside the ovals. If you make any other types of marks (check marks, etc.) the scanner will let you know that you need to correct your ballot. You can ask the scanner to return your ballot and make your corrections on a new ballot.

You will not get a receipt showing how you voted, however, you will continue to get your "I Voted" sticker to show you voted.

How Elected: In 2016, Maryland voters will elect one Senator. Voters elect two Senators from each State who serve six years. About one-third of the 100 members of the Senate is elected every two years. Senators must be at least 30 years old, have been citizens of the United States at least 9 years and be residents of the state they want to represent.

Term: Six years

#### 2. ECONOMY: What economic policies would you support to assist low and middle income citizens?

#### Chris Van Hollen:

I have a plan that cracks down on Wall Street's risky financial dealings and boosts paychecks of working Americans with a Paycheck Bonus Tax Credit, with a savers bonus to help families prepare for retirement. We must also strengthen the safety net, raise the minimum wage, improve access to affordable childcare, provide earned paid sick leave and family leave, and ensure equal pay for equal work.

#### Margaret Flowers:

Through my project "It's Our Economy" I have worked to educate about solutions that give people greater control over the economy and build community wealth. These include transitioning from corporate subsidies to a guaranteed basic income to end poverty, support for decentralized community-owned solar power, support for cooperatives, doubling social security benefits and improved Medicare for all.

#### 3. FOREIGN POLICY: What are the most important foreign policy issues and how would you address them?

#### Chris Van Hollen:

I opposed the Iraq War from the start and believe we must work with and support our allies in the Middle East to defeat ISIL. I oppose putting troops on the ground there and risking Irag 2.0. We need to support our soldiers and returning veterans by providing healthcare, education, and job opportunities, and ending veteran homelessness.

#### Margaret Flowers:

First is to recognize that the U.S. is the largest empire in the history of the world and that our aggressive foreign policy is creating greater insecurity. The empire economy is hurting our ability to meet our domestic needs. We need to scale back our global military presence, move to greater use of diplomacy and take the profit out of war. We also need to lead a global nuclear disarmament.

#### Chris Van Hollen:

Every community must be safe from toxic pollutants and chemicals like lead. The Sierra Club endorsed me because I fight for environmental justice and have a plan to address climate change by cutting carbon pollution while also putting money back in the pockets of middle class families. I've fought to stop oil drilling in the Chesapeake Bay watershed and for federal support for clean-up efforts.

#### Margaret Flowers:

Extreme extraction and use of fossil fuels and uranium for energy are poisoning the water, land and air and worsening climate change. We must move rapidly to a carbon-free, nuclear-free energy economy through a large scale just transition to produce sustainable sources of energy and clean transportation and to regenerative agriculture techniques and wetland restoration. This will create more jobs.

6. INEQUALITY: What policies would you support to address increasing concern about economic, racial, and social inequality?

#### Chris Van Hollen:

Our country must meet its promise of equal opportunity and justice for all, but we're not there yet. Our system is rigged for the wealthy and privileged. I want to stop CEOs from writing off big bonuses if they don't give employees raises. We have to open the doors of opportunity to all - with early education, debt-free college, and job training. We must end unjust mass incarceration.

#### Margaret Flowers:

We need to hold Wall Street executives accountable and create public and postal banks. I support taking the profit out of prisons, ending bail and jail time for nonviolent offenses, a public health approach to drugs and greater community control over police. I support equal access to high quality public education, reinvestment in low income communities and affordable housing, not gentrification.



Housing/Redevelopment: Governor Hogan has initiated the Project C.O.R.E.(Creating Opportunities for Renewal and Enterprise) to address the problem of Baltimore blight. What priorities would you propose for redevelopment of the sites?

#### Alan Walden:

Structures than can be rehabilitated should be. Those beyond reclamation must be razed without delay and redeveloped for housing, industry and, when and where appropriate, "green" space. Private industry must be encouraged to become more directly and heavily involved in the resurrection of blighted neighborhoods through stronger partnerships between the public and private sectors.

#### Catherine E. Pugh:

Will separate Department of Housing from the Housing Authority. I will hire the best & brightest to create greater productivity & efficiency. My priority will be to reduce concentrations of poverty by creating mixed income communities that offer quality affordable, middle-class & upscale housing. Offer incentives to developers & homeownership as a wealth building strategy.

Education: What is your plan for ensuring adequate educational progress and safe and appropriate school facilities for Baltimore City students?

#### Alan Walden:

Much greater emphasis than now exists must be placed on vocational education. Baltimore needs a skilled work force, and those skills should be taught in our public schools. Young people who aren't inclined toward higher education and want to work after they graduate from the school system must be taught how to work.

#### Catherine E. Pugh:

My intent is to return governance of our school system back to Baltimore. My first priority will be to conduct a system-wide performance audit. As Mayor, I will establish a goal of increasing our contribution to the school budget to 35% over the next four years. I will ensure professional development for educators and charge them with designing a curriculum the best practices in urban education.
