

Following school closures in March of 2020, meals were primarily distributed through the SFSP. As of March 2021, out-of-school meals are still being provided at SFSP sites. Pre-pandemic the SFSP operated from June to August. The SFSP data were collected from March 2020 to December 2020 and are not representative of a full school year. Over 35,000\* additional SFSP meals were served through a private school. Exactly 565,369 CACFP meals have been served to 20,798 participants through non-public school providers. The CACFP county-level data do not account for providers that operate sites within multiple counties; these data are represented in the Maryland state CACFP measurements.

#### Community Eligibility Provision (CEP): **51.80%** of Identified Student Percentage (ISP)

CEP allows schools to offer free meals to all students.

Districts or schools can participate if at least 40% of their students qualify to receive free school meals. CEP data is based on School Year 2020-2021 data. The utilization of CEP has increased by 14.4% since last year.
